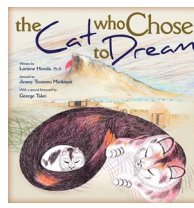


The Cat Who Chose To Dream

Activity Sheet for Pre-Teens to Adults



Do you feel the imprisonment of Japanese Americans during WWII was fair?

Why or why not?

On Page 11, Jimmy the Cat said, *“How can I truly be free if the people I love most are not?”* This is similar to what was explained by Ralph Lazo, a teenager of Mexican Irish heritage from Los Angeles, who bravely volunteered to live in the Manzanar prison camp because he felt it was unjust for his Japanese American best friends to be incarcerated while he remained free.

How do you think you’d react if this happened to your best friends?

On his comment: *“Others may have the power to shackle my body, but I always hold the power to free my mind.”*

What do you think Jimmy the Cat meant?
